that we are facing in terms of working with individuals who have addiction and mental health issues in addition to their PDD diagnosis, safe working conditions for staff and to advocate for better wages.


In Flanders Fields

What Is a Concussion?

A concussion is a type of traumatic brain injury-or TBI-caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or by a hit to the body that causes the head and brain to move rapidly back and forth. This sudden movement can cause the brain to bounce around or twist in the skull, creating chemical changes in the brain and sometimes stretching and damaging brain cells.

Concussions Are Serious

Medical providers may describe a concussion as a "mild" brain injury because concussions are usually not lifethreatening. Even so, the effects of a concussion can be serious.



Our Accreditation date is set for May 2019. Committees have been formed and are underway. The four main areas that we are focusing for Accreditation this year are:

- Standards review and success committee. This committee is reviewing the Accreditation standards and matching it to our existing policies and if a policy is missing or does not appear to meet the criteria of the standard they request it to be reviewed by the policy committee. In the New Year this committee will be responsible for attending staff meetings and meeting with staff to talk about the successes that have occurred in the various program areas.
- Policy review committee. This committee is responsible for reviewing and proposing changes to SPAN's existing policies and developing new policy if it is needed. This is done by referring to the Accreditation Standards and reviewing new and existing legislations. The policies are then forwarded to the board for approval.
- Manual review committee. This committee has been busy at work reviewing the manuals and ensuring that the practice and the processes explained in the manual are still consistent with the work that we do.
- Forms committee. This committee has been tasked with reviewing the forms that are used throughout the agency. They will review all the forms to see if they are still relevant, if forms need to be discontinued and improving the overall efficiency of our forms.

Preparing for accreditation is a lot of work so team work is essential to ensure all the work is done on time, to ensure that we are providing the best services to the individuals that we support. Thank you to everyone for your work to date and we look forward to the hard work that is still left to tackle.
